



DISCUSSION


The Authority entered into an agreement with the firm of Brown Armstrong November 21, 2019 to perform financial auditing services for calendar/fiscal years 2018 and 2019. Terms of the agreement included issuing their reports by April 30, 2020 and fees not exceeding \$9,000, \$4,500 for each audit year. The fees were based on previous audit experience on behalf of the Authority and the understanding on the part of the auditor there were relatively few transactions in either year requiring limited testing. In actuality, there was more activity in both years and it has been challenging to obtain information as the 2018 audit files were maintained by Kern County then switched in house in 2019. As a result, both years have been extremely difficult to reconcile to supporting documentation.

In a July 30th email from Thomas Young, CPA, Mr. Young requested an increase of \$5,000 to cover the cost of completing both the 2018 and 2019 audits. Mr. Young submitted a formal request letter August 14th that is included in the Board packet. During subsequent email communication with Mr. Young he estimated it will take appropriately 55 more hours at an average rate of \$90 per hour to complete both audits. If the actual time exceeds 55 hours, there will be no charge for those hours.

RECOMMENDED BOARD ACTION(S)

Staff recommends Board approval of the request for an additional \$5,000 to complete the 2018 and 2019 audits.

Dear Board of Directors and Mr. Zdeba:

As you know, we were hired to conduct the December 31, 2018 and 2019 audits of the IWVGA. The original fee for those engagements was \$9,000, or \$4,500 per audit. However, those fees were based on the understanding that there was little or no activity in both years and therefore testing would be limited. Unfortunately that was not the case, as there was quite a lot of activity in either year and it has been difficult to obtain information as the 2018 audit files were maintained by the County and then it switched in house in 2019 and both years have been extremely difficult to reconcile to supporting documentation. Other items encountered during the audit which have caused an increase in fees were as follows:

- Year-end closing entries were not prepared.
- Year-end accruals of accounts receivable and account payable were not recorded.
- No financial statements were prepared by management for either year.
- Audit information was difficult to obtain from the County and IWVGA partly due to COVID 19.
- We noted untimely submission of expenditures for the Department of Water Resources reimbursements.
- IWVGA took over finances from Kern County at the end of February 2019. Therefore, preparation and types of reports are different from what was obtained from our previous audit.
- There were significantly more revenues in 2018 and 2019 as compared to 2016 and 2017.
- There were significantly more expenditures in 2018 and 2019 as compared to 2016 and 2017.
- All revenues and expenses are unclassified and provided in single account balances.

We are asking for an increase of \$5,000 to cover the additional costs of performing both audits. We have enjoyed our past relationship and look forward to continuing to serve IWVGA. If you accept this proposal, please sign the copy and return it to us via e-mail or regular mail.

DISCUSSION

The Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Authority ("Authority") entered into an agreement with the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher Education on behalf of Desert Research Institute ("DRI") May 23, 2018 for the purpose of using the groundwater model in support of the Authority's work in development of the Groundwater Sustainability Plan. The agreement was in effect from June 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020. As the result of a need on the part of the Brackish Water Study Group ("Brackish Group") to run model scenarios related to the Brackish Water Resource Feasibility Study funded through a Prop. 1 grant from the Department of Water Resources, an amendment to the agreement was adopted November 15, 2018.

As the original agreement expired June 30, 2020 and there is need for the Brackish Group to continue to have the ability to request modeling services from DRI, it is requested the agreement be extended by way of an amendment to June 30, 2021. Consistent with the Reimbursement Agreement section of the amendment, the Brackish Group will reimburse the Authority for costs incurred by DRI for developing and running any model scenarios requested by the Group.

RECOMMENDED BOARD ACTION(S)

Staff recommends Board approve the request to extend the terms of the May 23, 2018 agreement and the DRAFT amendment to that agreement through June 30, 2021 in a form approved by counsel.



AMENDMENT NUMBER THREE TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE INDIAN WELLS VALLEY GROUNDWATER AUTHORITY and the BOARD OF REGENTS of the NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION on behalf of the DESERT RESEARCH INSTITUTE

THIS AMENDMENT THREE, effective the 30th day of June, 2020, is by and between the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Authority ("SPONSOR") and the Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher Education on behalf of the Desert Research Institute ("DRI") agree as follows:

RECITALS:

- **1.** On May 23th, 2018, the SPONSOR and DRI entered into an Agreement ("Original Agreement") for the use of a groundwater model to support the SPONSOR's work on required Groundwater Sustainability Plan; and
- 2. While the initial term of that agreement was to run from June 1, 2018 to June 30, 2020, the SPONSOR and DRI now mutually wish to extend the Agreement term to June 30, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, the SPONSOR and DRI mutually agree as follows:

- 1. Section 2. Term and Responsibilities of the Original Agreement is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:
 - (a) Pursuant to this Agreement, DRI, for a period from June 1, 2018 to June 30, 021, shall perform the duties/tasks in accordance with the DRI Scope of Work and Budget, a copy of which is attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and by reference made part of this Agreement. Either party may terminate this Agreement on thirty (30) days written notice.
- **2.** Except as modified by this amendment, all the remaining terms and conditions of the Original Agreement, and any other amendments thereto, shall remain in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Parties hereto agree to this Amendment Three to Original Agreement.

DISCUSSION

The Board of the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Authority adopted Ordinance 02-18 "Establishing Groundwater Extraction Fees and the Rules and Regulations and Procedures for Their Implementation" July 19, 2018. The Ordinance pertains to all non de minimis extractors within the basin as defined in California Water Code section 10721(e). Section 4 of the Ordinance states, "No later than August 20, 2018, a Groundwater Extraction Facility within the boundaries of the Basin shall be registered with the Authority by the Groundwater Extractor." Section 6 further states, "Before the 10th day of each calendar month, the Groundwater Extractor shall self-report the necessary data from its Groundwater Extraction Facility on the self-reporting form provided by the Authority and pay the Groundwater Extraction Fee set forth in Section 3 above."

Frank Bellino has been confirmed by other local agriculture operations, the RealQuest property database and photographs included with this staff report to be a non de minimis agricultural extractor. County assessor's data also confirms the property is being used to grow pistachios. Mr. Bellino has failed to register his well(s) and has failed to comply with payment of the groundwater extraction fee since the fee became effective September 2018. Mr. Bellino was mailed notices advising him of his failure to comply on three separate occasions; July 2018, November 2018 and January 2019. The letters have stated, "Please be advised that your continued failure to register your groundwater production well(s) using the enclosed Registration Form and payment of the groundwater extraction fee will subject you to legal action by the Authority, including a court order to prevent you from extracting groundwater from the basin and requiring payment of the groundwater extraction fee, with penalties, as a result of your non-compliance." He failed to respond to every outreach effort.

Mr. Bellino was sent a letter by certified mail August 4th notifying him of the public hearing set for the Groundwater Authority meeting on Thursday, August 20, 2020 during which he would be provided with the opportunity to address the Board regarding the groundwater extractions on his property and the possible actions the Groundwater Authority may take regarding apparent failure to abide by the provisions of Ordinance 02-18. Mr. Bellino was not able to attend the August 20th meeting due to a medical issue. He was sent a second letter by certified mail August 28th advising him "the public hearing that you were previously notified of in the attached letter and staff report has been continued to the September 17, 2020 Authority Board meeting. As previously advised, it


is requested that you contact the General Manager no later than 24 hours prior to the meeting to obtain a dial-in phone number so you may attend the meeting which is being held in accordance with COVID-19 precautions. If the provided date is problematic, you may also speak with the General Manager about a continuance but in such an event you should discuss and ensure the continuance by no later than September 10, 2020." There has been no response to that letter as well.

Water Code section 10730.6 expressly provides the Board with the following authorities to address violations of Ordinance 02-18:

- 1) Assessment of a 10% penalty and interest at 1% per month of delinquency;
- 2) Order the cessation all groundwater extractions until the violations have been cured and all delinquent charges, penalties and interest have been paid; and/or,
- 3) Bring suit seeking judicial orders and attachments.

RECOMMENDED BOARD ACTION(S)

- 1) Open hearing and take testimony;
- 2) Close hearing, consider testimony; and,
- 3) If appropriate order remedies which could include part, or all, of the following:
 - a. Order the owner and staff to come to agreement on delinquent charges within a specified time and impose the statutory penalty and interest on the delinquent amounts;
 - b. If agreement is not reached within a specified time, order the owner to cease all extractions until the violations have been cured including the payment of all charges, penalties and interest;
 - c. Authorize staff to bring suit seeking judicial orders and attachments.

Agreement to Toll the Statute of Limitations Regarding

Potential Challenges to the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Basin Groundwater Sustainability Plan

OFFER OF COMPROMISE

This Agreement to Toll the Statute of Limitations Regarding Potential Challenges to the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Basin Groundwater Sustainability Plan ("Agreement") is hereby entered into by and among the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Authority ("IWVGA") and Meadowbrook Dairy Real Estate, LLC, Big Horn Fields, LLC, Brown Road Fields, LLC, Highway 395 Fields, LLC, and The Meadowbrook Mutual Water Company (collectively, "Meadowbrook"), (hereinafter referred to collectively as "Parties" and may be referred to individually as a "Party").

Recitals

- 1. WHEREAS, the IWVGA is a groundwater sustainability agency, formed and designated under the Sustainable Groundwater Management Agency Act (Water Code § 10720 et seq.) with responsibility for adopting a groundwater sustainability plan ("GSP") for the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Basin ("Basin");
- 2. WHEREAS, the IWVGA adopted the GSP on January 16, 2020;
- WHEREAS, the Parties entered into an Agreement to Toll the Statute of Limitations Regarding Potential Challenges to the Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Basin Groundwater Sustainability Plan effective March 13, 2020 ("March 13, 2020 Agreement");
- 4. WHEREAS, the purpose of the March 13, 2020 Agreement was to toll any and all applicable statutes of limitation, without exception, regarding any claims that may be asserted by a Party to the March 13, 2020 Agreement (whether by petition or complaint) arising from the IWVGA's adoption and/or implementation of the GSP, including but not limited to any and all actions expressly and impliedly authorized under applicable law (collectively "Claims");
- 5. WHEREAS, the Parties to the March 13, 2020 Agreement agreed to toll and extend the applicable statute of limitations for each Party to file any Claims that arise from the adoption and/or implementation of the GSP until the earlier of: (i) seven (7) calendar days from the date at which the IWVGA formally adopts the Transient Pool and Fallowing Program (as defined within the GSP), or (ii) June 30, 2020;
- 6. WHEREAS, the Parties to the March 13, 2020 Agreement thereafter entered into an Agreement effective June 18, 2020, to extend the Tolling Period until September 30, 2020.
- 7. WHEREAS, in light of the prevailing conditions in California and the August 21, 2020 IWVGA approval of GSP implementation actions including the Transient Pool and

Fallowing Program and the Replenishment Fee, the Parties wish to further extend the Tolling Period until January 31, 2021, unless earlier terminated as provided for herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, which are incorporated into the operative provisions of this Agreement by this reference, and the mutual and dependent covenants herein contained, it is hereby mutually agreed by the Parties hereto as follows:

- 1. The Recitals set forth in the beginning of this Agreement are hereby incorporated into the terms of the Agreement as though set forth in full herein.
- 2. This Agreement is effective on September 17, 2020 ("Effective Date").
- 3. The Parties hereby agree to toll and extend the applicable statute of limitations for each Party to file any Claims (regardless of the cause of action, remedy and the judicial or administrative tribunal) that arise from the adoption and/or implementation of the GSP including any and all actions expressly or impliedly authorized under applicable law, until January 31, 2021, unless earlier terminated as provided for herein. The period from the Effective Date to January 31, 2021 (or earlier termination date) is the "Tolling Period."
- 4. The Parties hereby waive, and shall not assert, any defense based on statute of limitations or other claim of or related to delay or lack of timeliness of filing based on the fact that a claim, defense, cause of action, or argument expired during the Tolling Period.
- 5. If any third party asserts in a judicial or administrative proceeding brought by any Party that a statute of limitations or other applicable time period established by statute, code, equity, rule of court, or other law prevents the prosecution of any Claims, the Parties agree and will argue to the Court that all statute of limitations and other applicable time period established by statute, code, rule of court, or law were tolled during the Tolling Period, and the running of any such period shall be calculated by excluding the Tolling Period. Further they will inform the Court that their intention was to facilitate compromise among the Parties hereto.

6. This Agreement:

- a. Represents the sole and entire agreement by and among the Parties;
- b. Shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California;
- May be executed in counterparts with the same force and effect as if executed in one complete document by all Parties;
- d. May not be modified, except by a writing executed by each of the Parties;
- e. Does not preclude a claim being commenced by any Party prior to the expiration of the Tolling Period and without prior notice of filing;

Subject: Project Update Memorandum - August 2020 Activities

In August, Capitol Core primarily focused its work on both outreach for funding procurement as well monitoring the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for policy items related to water scarcity and Department of Defense installations. This memorandum will outline the specific tasks completed in August, and the next steps we will conduct during the month of September.

National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA, H.R. 6395 and S. 4049)

As mentioned in our July update, we have been monitoring the House and Senate versions of the NDAA bills for policy related to water resiliency and sustainment. Both the Senate and House versions of the NDAA moved forward through their respective houses. We have proposed amendments to the WATER Act provisions within the House bill to address the need for collaborative and regional solutions to water supply for military communities in water-constrained areas. We are working closely with our local delegation as well as with pertinent Armed Service Committee members to move our amendments forward and have them heard in Conference Committee.

As of early September, our local delegation including Representatives Cook and McCarthy and Senator Feinstein are supportive of our amendments. Representatives Cook and Senator Feinstein signed a joint letter of support for the amendments to be included in the Conference Committee negotiations and is attached to this report. We expect that the Conference Committee members will be determined and convene at some point in September. We will continue to monitor the progress of the Committee and our proposed amendments.

Other Federal Legislation

As part of our Scope of Work, Task 3 instructs us to determine potential funding sources that the Groundwater Authority may avail themselves to assist financially with the water infrastructure project. There are a few bills that we are monitoring and have actively engaged on including:

- AWIA and DWIA (Sen. Barasso, R-WY): As mentioned last month, these bills remain in Committee awaiting further markups. We will continue to monitor their progress in the upcoming month and determine whether these provisions may be rolled into omnibus infrastructure bills currently moving forward in the Congress.
- Water for Tomorrow Act (Sen. Harris, D-CA): Senator Harris introduced the Water for Tomorrow Act, which adds further programs that may be beneficial to the Authority's goals. Specifically, there are provisions that would provide funding for disadvantaged communities to address both water supply shortfalls and wastewater treatment needs. The bill from Senator Harris is part of a set of companion legislation moving through the House from Representative Jim Costa (D-CA). We are coordinating

with IWVGA staff to determine whether there are eligible projects for this legislation should it or the companion House legislation pass, and we are monitoring its progress in the Senate.

Federal Funding Opportunities – DCIP Program

As we have discussed in the past, the Defense Community Infrastructure Program (DCIP) may be a potential source of funding for the project. This current fiscal year (FY 20-21) represents the first \$50 million of the total \$100 million that Congress Authorizes for DCIP under the pilot project. We anticipate that the remaining \$50 million will be Appropriated by the Congress during the FY2021 cycle. The remaining \$50 million appropriation is in the 2021 NDAA, though it remains to be seen if it will be appropriated when the House and Senate work through their differing versions in Conference Committee. Based upon the outcomes of the DCIP pilot project, the Congress will be required to reauthorize DCIP and determine future amounts for appropriation.

Under the current guidelines, the IWVGA imported infrastructure project will be eligible for program funding once the Board has selected a project and completed engineering and permitting. As the project is not "shovel ready" it is not eligible for funding during this currently-appropriated tranche. DOD has interpreted the single-year funding by the Congress to mean that projects must be "shovel ready" and have the ability to be completed within the fiscal year of the funding. As we expected, and previously reported to the Authority, the IWVGA project does not currently meet these criteria. IWVGA cannot seek listing and eligibility of the IWVGA Project under the proposed implementation guidelines until such time as the Authority makes a determination on the final project route and begins engineering and permitting. Once such a determination is made, the IWVGA Project is eligible for application.

The Office of Economic Adjustment (OEA) released its list of projects it will consider as "finalists" for funding consideration from this current fiscal year tranche of money. Please see the attached list for full program details. The OEA received over 100 applications for funding this year and selected 16 finalists for consideration. The projects that were selected skewed differently than we anticipated due to a criteria change for judgment. The OEA earlier this year completed the guidelines for project eligibility, and added a "military family quality of life" component as a base criterion for award judgment. As such, the list of eligible projects deemed "finalists" skewed heavily towards educational facilities and recreation centers, and left many resiliency infrastructure projects off of the list of finalists.

We will continue to monitor the progress of the DCIP for further appropriations in the current 2021 NDAA and will continue to work with the OEA to recommend that the DCIP include resiliency projects as top priorities for future funding.

Other Activities

During August, we attended the August 20-21 Board meetings and provided comments and remarks regarding potential imported water supplies and the current state of the water market.

Next Steps

In September, we will continue to monitor the NDAA and other water-specific policy bills as they move forward in the Congress. We plan to work actively with the Conference Committee as they address the differences in the NDAA bills and our amendments. We will also monitor the progress of the other pieces of federal legislation that we are monitoring and will continue our outreach with the Navy/DoD.

Dear Chairman Smith, Chairman Inhofe, Ranking Member Thornberry, and Ranking Member Reed:

As you begin conference negotiations on the Fiscal Year 2021 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), we write to urge modification of existing language in Section 2826 of H.R. 6395 requiring the Department of Defense to perform risk-based assessments to determine water scarcity at installations. These modifications are necessary to 1) ensure fully accurate assessments of water scarcity at DOD installations by including water utilization of personnel housed off-installation and 2) allow the DOD to consider participating in regional projects to achieve water sustainability.

As you know, water access and sustainability is important for all military installations, and it is critically important to understand the impacts of water scarcity for the mission resiliency of installations in water-challenged basins. Including these modifications in the FY2021 NDAA would provide options for the DOD to address water scarcity challenges and to take into consideration the full impacts of the water needs for both the installation and the essential personnel that serve on bases where reporting will be required.

We commend you on your leadership and commitment to our servicemembers, and we urge adoption of these clarifying modifications to improve water management and security on military installations in the final FY2021 NDAA.

Program Launch Summary

Overview

In June 2020 Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Authority (IWVGA) and WaterWise Consulting (WWC) entered into a contract to provide a rebate program to Severely Disadvantaged Communities (SDACs) within the IWVGA area. This water conservation program will provide rebates to both residential and commercial sites for the installation of high-efficiency water devices. The program is funded for 10 months of administration, and is set to conclude in May 2021. In July work began with program content design and marketing.

Program Design

The contract between IWVGA and WWC calls on the expertise and experience of WWC to design a rebate program for water savings devices. Design of the program, including determining the types of devices and rebate amounts that would be offered through the program, was a significant focus of work in July. This required coordination with the participating agencies and communication with IWVGA.

The program that was developed will offer rebates for the following devices at the listed rates.

Water Savings Device	Rebate Amount
HE Toilets, 1.28 gal/flush	\$150
HE Toilets, 1.1 gal/flush	\$250
HE Clothes Washer	\$100
HE Dishwasher	\$100
HE Urinal, 0.125 gal / flush	\$300
HE Urinal, Waterless	\$400
Evaporative Cooler	\$100
Hot Water Recirculating Pump	\$100

This list of devices is designed to create greater incentives to make more water efficient choices, even within the program, with increasing rebates offered for higher efficiency toilets and urinals. The range of devices is designed to appeal to both residential home owners and commercial property owners.

The program is designed as a simple application process (Appendix A) that allows property owners to apply for all rebates with one application. Once approved to participate, funds are reserved and a Notice to Proceed is sent to the applicant. When the applicant has purchased and installed the devices, they submit materials to confirm the quantity, make, and model of final devices. If a post-inspection is required, WWC staff will inspect prior to approving the installation. Once the installation is approved, the applicant is sent an approval notice and WWC invoices IWVGA. A rebate is sent to the applicant once the rebate funds are received from IWVGA.

Website Development, Marketing and Outreach

Once the specific rebates had been determined, WWC worked with the subcontractor Green Media Creations (GMC) to design a website for the program and develop marketing materials. In order to complete the website, the program Terms and Conditions (Appendix B) had to be established, and the application form had to be developed. The resulting website was launched on August 3rd (Appendix C) and can be found at: https://www.waterwise-consulting.com/iwrebates

It was determined in consultation with IWVGA that the most effective outreach method for the area would be a combination of direct mailings and posting notices in key locations. Research of the appropriate public locations for posting notices, and identification of other marketing opportunities, identified that a postcard would be the most appropriate marketing tool. A postcard for the program was designed and printed (Appendix D). The postcard will be used for direct mailings, distribution by agencies, and posting in highly trafficked public areas.

In Closing

Launch Month

As we move into August the program will launch with postcard mailings and distribution of materials to agencies and posting in public areas. We anticipate significant interest in the program, tempered by ongoing concerns caused by the global pandemic. As with all rebate programs, there may be a delay between customers learning about the program and participation. Upfront costs of purchase and installation can slow initial participation though we anticipate increasing participation over time.

Budget

Total costs in July were \$12,840. This included the \$4,000 website development fee, Program Manager costs of \$5,000, and Design, Marketing & Outreach costs of \$3,840. This leaves \$137,160 in the program budget.

It is the customer's option to participate in the Program. The Program currently provides rebates for high efficiency toilets, clothes washers, dishwashers, urinals, recirculating pumps and evaporative coolers. Rebates are only available to participants that are located in severely disadvantaged communities. Newly constructed sites/ new construction will not qualify for this program. The participant is required to keep the installed device(s) for a minimum of 5 years. Failure to meet this condition may require participant to refund all or a portion of the incentive.

In order to participate in the Program, participants must submit an original rebate application before purchasing any device in order to secure their rebate. This application includes information on currently installed device(s), new device(s) selected (make and model), and quantity of devices. Along with this information the participant must also submit a picture of currently installed device(s). After the materials are submitted participants will be given a notice to proceed and have 45 days to purchase and install the device(s). After the device(s) is installed, the participant must submit a picture along with a copy of the purchase receipt in order to finalize the rebate. All rebates are subject to an in person inspection for verification of actual installation.





Overview - Public Launch

In June 2020 Indian Wells Valley Groundwater Authority (IWVGA) and WaterWise Consulting (WWC) entered into a contract to provide a rebate program to Severely Disadvantaged Communities (SDACs) within the IWVGA area. This water conservation program provides rebates to both residential and commercial sites for the installation of high-efficiency water devices. The program is funded for 10 months of administration, and is set to conclude in May 2021. In August work focused on the public launch, outreach and marketing.

Program Details

Marketing and Outreach Launch

The program website went live on August 3rd. Program marketing launched in August with a postcard distribution outreach campaign. Postcards were mailed in August to approximately 1,000 contacts provided by member agencies of IWVGA. These contacts may not entirely be qualifying SDAC residents, but it was determined that the increased word of mouth generated by the additional contacts would be beneficial for the program.

Postcards were also distributed to several highly trafficked public locations in the region.

Distribution attempted but unsuccessful in August:

- Harbor Freight 250 Balsam St, Ridgecrest, CA 93555 Corporate policy prohibits advertising in all forms.

Arrangements were made in August to provide postcards to two local water district offices, Inyokern and Searles, for distribution through their front offices. Time spent on this included picking up materials from the printing facility and arranging details with the agencies. Postcards will be shipped to these offices in September.

Program Applicants and Customer Service

Immediate response to the program marketing was low. One customer called regarding the program, and no customers emailed to the program or submitted applications in the month of August.

Our team was prepared for launch, with intake forms, email accounts, phone lines, and template letters ready for customer interaction. Staff were available during business hours Monday through Friday for incoming calls, emails, and to mail out printed copies of applications as needed.

Budget

Total costs in August were \$6,405. This included the \$5,000 monthly administration fee, Program Manager costs of \$125, and Design, Marketing & Outreach costs of \$1,280. Most hourly costs went towards mailings, as well as coordination for and distribution of postcards beyond the mailing lists. Remaining program budget at the end of August was \$130,755.

In Closing

Public Launch Month

The program successfully launched to the public this month, with the website going live on August 3rd, postcards mailed to residents, distribution of marketing materials to agencies underway, and postcards placed in high traffic public areas. We anticipate significant interest in the program, tempered by ongoing concerns caused by the global pandemic. As with similar new rebate programs, there may be a delay between customers learning about the program and participation. Upfront costs of purchase and installation can slow initial participation, though we anticipate increasing participation over time.
