## - Proposition 68 - Grant Funding (2019)

- Sustainable Groundwater Management Grant Program
- Administered by the Department of Water Resources (DWR)
- "Planning Grants Proposal Solicitation Package - Round 3"

Planning Grants Proposal Solicitation Package - Round 3

- Released September 9, 2019
- Applications due November 1, 2019
- Final Awards during March 2020
- Approximately $\$ 47$ million in competitive grants available for sustainable groundwater planning and implementation projects


## IWVGA Board Meeting

 October 17, 2019- Proposition 68 - Available Funding
- Minimum grant amount = \$200,000 (if previously awarded Proposition 1)
- Maximum grant amount = Up to \$2 million (but reduced if previously awarded Proposition 1)
- Preliminary indication from DWR is that IWVGA can receive up to $\$ 330,000$ if successfully awarded
- Previous Proposition 1 Funding (2017)
- IWVGA received $\$ 2,146,000$
- \$1.5 Million for GSP development (Category 2)
- \$646,000 for SDAC projects (Category 1)


## IWVGA Board Meeting

 October 17, 2019- Proposition 68 - Local Cost Share
- Local match is $25 \%$, but may be reduced based on "Disadvantaged Areas" (i.e. DACs, SDACs, and EDAs)
- IWVGA cost share may be reduced to $15 \%$
- Proposition 68 - Projects
- Eligible projects include activities associated with development or implementation of a GSP
- IWVGA proposed Projects include:

1) Imported Water Supply Procurement (Capitol Core, recover past costs)
2) Groundwater Allocation Process (recover past costs)
3) Shallow Well Mitigation Plan (preparation in 2020)
4) Groundwater Pumping Fee Support (recover past costs if eligible)
