Subject Draft comes up short in two material respects:


First, the most salient feature of our Basin Setting is the exceptionally high percentage of natural recharge required to cover the basic health and safety needs (think indoor residential and indoor work place water *uses*) of the basin's 35,000 residents. These numbers need to be clearly accounted for in the Water Budget starting at Page 3-15 lest management actions misallocate our scarce groundwater resource and thereby threaten public health and safety. See SGMA Regulation 354.18(b)(3) for the need to quantify groundwater outflows by water *use*.

Second, the first Paragraph on Page 3-22 states that "the natural sustainable yield can be augmented with direct recharge projects (e.g., recycled water or imported water)." I understand that the feasibility of such projects is highly questionable due to numerous financial, political, environmental, and legal hurdles. SGMA Regulation 354.44.(b)(6) demands an explanation of the source and reliability of import water as a condition of a GSP's reliance upon it. Without such a credible explanation in hand, the above quoted statement will lead most readers to falsely believe that they face no significant threat to their health and safety through misallocation of natural recharge.
